The following is the syllabus for the graduate course at Ottawa University. The syllabus is aligned to the [appropriate state/national standards to which the course applies] and Arizona State Teacher Standards.

Description:

Class will explore PowerPoint games utilizing various game templates. Templates include variations of Jeopardy, Who Wants to be a Millionaire, Twenty Questions and more.

Templates can be easily modified to meet specific needs and can cover almost every curriculum topic. Participants must have the capability of sending or saving large files.

Prerequisite: PowerPoint for Teachers is recommended. **Twelve hours of additional practice required for two credits. An additional outside project will be required to earn three credits.**
